Creative Climate Leadership (CCL) is a transformative experience for artists and cultural activists to explore climate justice and ethical leadership, and take impactful action with care and reciprocity. The five-day intensive programme enables participants to explore collaborative and distributive leadership through creativity in the context of a rapidly changing world.

Creative Climate Leadership Benelux 2023 took place from 27 - 31 March 2023 at the Koningsteen Centre in Belgium. The Koningsteen hosts eco-friendly and environmentally responsible retreats, residentials and workshops. The programme brought together 25 participants living and/or working in Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxemburg and the UK with rich knowledge and lived experiences in areas as varied as music, performing arts, activism, communications, governance, theatre, museums, heritage, storytelling, photography, filmmaking, extended reality, cultural policy, education, design and entrepreneurship. Together, they join a powerful global network of changemakers bringing creativity, courage and imagination, sowing seeds for transformation across art and culture.



What is the Creative Climate Leadership Programme?

CCL is an international training and transformation programme to empower artists and cultural professionals to take action on the climate and ecological crisis with impact, creativity, and resilience.

The programme strengthens the extraordinary climate leadership found across the creative and cultural ecosystem, and champions positive change using an approach orientated towards justice and inclusion. Each iteration of the course is infused with the entrepreneurial ideas of CCL alumni.

250 people, working in over 30 countries, have taken part in CCL programmes so far. Our alumni join an evolving international network of creatives taking action and mobilising others in their field, through events, workshops, artistic works, and projects.

About the Creative Climate Leadership Benelux Programme:

CCL Benelux was funded by Porticus and was held at the Koningsteen Centre from 27 - 31 March 2023. The Koningsteen, in the Flemish Region of Belgium, hosts eco-friendly and environmentally responsible retreats, residentials and workshops. The appetite to participate in the CCL Programme has grown continually since it first launched, with over 100 high calibre applications submitted for the latest iterations of the programme.

a centre hosting and facilitating a wide
variety of workshops, training, retreats and
educational programs geared towards personal
development, healing and well-being.
